Breeding Operation Stallion Service Contract

This certifies _____ has engaged one Service to
CASH MY BAR CHEX for the mare _____
Maiden _____ Dry _____ Wet _____ Registration No. _____
For the 20 _____ season at \$ _____ for live foal.

This service is subject to the following:

1. Booking fee (non-refundable) of \$_____ of the above fee payable with this contract and the balance of \$_____ plus all unpaid expenses will be payable upon receipt of invoice or when mare is picked up, which ever is first.
2. The mare shall be in a healthy and sound breeding condition. A veterinarian's certificate shall accompany each mare, and failure to furnish this will be your authorization to have the mare examined by stallion owners veterinarian, and the examination shall be done at mare owners expense.
3. Mares that are not halter broken will not be accepted.
4. It is my understanding (Jim and/or Cindy Meldrum—Triple Diamond Ranch, LLC) will not be responsible for accident, sickness or death to the mare and/or her colt. Cindy and/or Jim Meldrum will exercise judgement in the care and supervision of mare. It is also understood that I, likewise, will not be responsible for any disease, accident, or injury to the stallion.
5. Cindy and/or Jim Meldrum agrees to diligently try to settle my mare. If, however, you do not settle her, I will hold Cindy and/or Jim Meldrum harmless. We will not guarantee a live foal for any mare leaving before being checked safe in foal by our attending veterinarian.
6. It is agreed that you guarantee a live foal from this mating. Should the foal not stand and suck, we will give you a return privilege, the following Breeding Season. This guarantee will apply only if we are notified one week from death. This notice must be accompanied by a statement from a licensed veterinarian.
7. It is further agreed that should the above named stallion die, or become unfit for service; or, if mare dies, or becomes unfit, then this contract shall become null and void. In either event the stud fee will be credited toward breeding to any stallion standing at Cindy and Jim Meldrum's in the subsequent year, but no cash refund will be paid.
8. When Cindy and/or Jim Meldrum signs and returns one copy of this contract to me, it will then be a binding contract on both parties, subject to the above terms and conditions.
9. The deposit is not refundable.
- 10. All expenses must be paid before or when mare is picked up.**
- 11. Coggins Test, current vaccinations and worming is required on all mares on arrival or pay Cindy and Jim Meldrum or veterinarian a fee to administer Coggins Test, vaccinations and worming.**

NEW ILLINOIS LAW EFFECTIVE FEBRUARY 1, 2004.

Illinois Entry Requirements for Equines—Effective February 1, 2004. All equines entering Illinois for any reason other than slaughter must be accompanied by a negative test for EIA conducted within a year if the animal is more than one year of age, certificate of veterinary inspection issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of entry, and an entry permit issued by the Illinois Department of Agriculture.

Entry permits are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture (217) 782-4944 and are issued 24 hours a day, seven days a week. THERE IS NO CHARGE FOR OBTAINING AN ENTRY PERMIT FROM THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

The following information will be required for the entry permit:

1. Name and mailing address of owner of the animal.
2. Date of the EIA test.
3. Location where the animal is going.
4. Permit numbers are also available online at www.agr.state.il.us

A password to access the permit program is required and will be issued to veterinarians by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Animal Health (217) 782-4944 weekdays 8:00 a.m.—4:30 p.m. CST.

For equine only: The entry permit is good for 30 days (the life of the health certificate). It is requested that if the health certificate is used for multiple entries (i.e. trail rides or shows on several weekends), that all events during the 30 day period be included on the health certificate. If an event is not listed on the health certificate, the owner is asked to call the Department, provide the permit number and provide the location of the additional event(s).

For equine sales: A blanket permit is available for out-of-state equine sales and auctions. For more information, please call the Bureau of Animal Health (217) 782-4944.

In accordance with the Illinois Diseased Animals Act (510 ILCS 50/1 and the regulations pertaining thereto 8 Ill. Adm. Code 85), violators are guilty of a business offense and shall be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$1,000.
